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hawk-i (Healthy & Well Kids in Iowa) Health Insurance

To qualify, a child must live in Iowa and:

Be under 19 years old

Have no other health insurance

Be a citizen of the United States or a qualified alien

Be in a family that meets the hawk-i income limits

Cannot be the dependent of a State of Iowa employee

Children who qualify for Medicaid cannot get hawk-i

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Medicaid Presumptive Eligibility

Assistance with application for Medicaid for immediate needs, provides temporary Medicaid coverage for children ages 0-19, pregnant women, and adults 19-64 that meeting the eligibility requirements of the program. It is best to call ahead to make sure there is someone available to assist.

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Child Car Seat Technician (Child Passenger Safety Technician)

Free service to anyone on how to correctly install a child car seat in their vehicle

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Public Health Maintenance Nursing

Provides home care for uninsured, help with prescription assistance programs, provides disease prevention information, health screenings (blood pressure checks, blood sugar checks, cholesterol checks, & etc.) and more...

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Communicable Disease Follow-up

All reportable diseases are communicated through the Iowa Disease Surveillance System (IDSS) from the healthcare provider or laboratory, we then do follow up with the patients to assist with containment by gathering information and providing education on the disease.

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Tuberculosis (TB) Management

Provides medication monitoring, follow up, and patient education on TB.
