INSTALLATION OF PRIVATE SEPTIC SYSTEMS


<u>Basic Steps to follow—</u> SEPTIC PERMIT APPLICATION

In 2018, Marion County introduced the option of applying for your septic permit online through the BEACON (SCHNEIDER) website. You may begin the process at any time using this method.

After locating your property, either by name, address or parcel number, you will have the option to apply for a permit.



Click on the Apply for Permit button and it will take you to the next page, asking you which permit you would like to apply for:

Select the septic permit option to take you to the log in screen for the Online Permitting:



If you already have an account it will take you through the steps to apply for a permit. Otherwise, you can create a unique login and password using your personal EMAIL and then you will begin the process. Our office understands that you may not feel comfortable using the online application process, so you may still contact our office to begin the permit.

The next steps are department specific guidelines and are included within the online process, but are outlined here for your educational purposes.

STEP 1 – SITE EVALUATION Contact the Environmental Health office to set up a meeting at your site. It is recommended that you also select a contractor and have them out at the site as well. The area for the septic system can then be laid out and any setbacks will be noted. A basic probing of the soil will be done and options will be discussed on different types of septic systems. If it is determined that the soils are unacceptable for a soil absorption type system, skip to step 3.

STEP 2 – PERCOLATION/SOIL TEST. Subsurface soil absorption septic systems are considered to be the best available treatment for private wastewater. However, the right type of soil must be present for effective treatment and for system longevity. State code requires that a percolation or soil test be conducted before any subsurface soil absorption system is installed. Marion County also requires that percolation and soil tests be done by a certified engineer. Special care should be taken to not dig, alter, or in any way, compact the soil of the test area.

STEP 3 – SEPTIC PERMIT. You must have a Septic Permit before the installation of your system. Once we have received the engineer's report (if applicable), the permit application process may continue within the online permitting system, or you may come to our office and complete the process. The permit is valid for one year and costs \$200 for a new system or \$100 for a repair.

STEP 4 – INSPECTION AND APPROVAL. Currently, the Marion County Board of Health requires that all private contractors installing or repairing private septic systems in Marion County hold the CIOWTS (Certified Installer of Wastewater Treatment Systems) credential. After installation, the system is to be left exposed so that it can be fully inspected. The contractor is required to contact us 24-hours in advance so that we can schedule the inspection appointment. Once the system is inspected and final approval is given, a copy of the permit, reports, and a map will be available upon request.

Private septic systems are an effective way to treat domestic wastewater, but care must be taken to keep them working properly. Examples include: having good water conservation practices, limited use of garbage disposals, and avoid flushing harsh chemicals. We also recommend not using any septic additives. Instead, the best maintenance practice is to have the septic tank inspected every three to five years to see if it needs to be pumped out. The Marion County Environmental Health office is available to answer these and any other septic questions you might have.
