Families in Appanoose, Marion, and Monroe Counties:

Marion County Public Health will no longer be providing Child & Adolescent Health services in your county after September 30th, 2022. To ensure that your child can easily continue to receive services, your child's health records are being transferred to your new provider, American Home Finding Association. Marion County Public Health provided services for your child(ren) as part of the Child & Adolescent Health program. These services may have included oral health services, such as sealants at your child's school, screenings such as developmental or vision screens, or lead testing.

This does NOT change your Medicaid benefits, Medicaid managed care provider assignment (Amerigroup, Iowa Total Care) or your dental managed care provider assignment (MCNA, Delta Dental of Iowa). This letter does not change the provider for other services such as WIC. You will receive communication from that program directly if the provider will be changing.

Beginning October 1st, 2022, American Home Finding Association will provide services for families with children from birth through the age of 21. These services may include:

- Help locating a doctor or dentist in your area so your family can receive regular and on-going medical and dental care.
- Help obtain health care coverage.
- Reminders when your child/children need medical and dental checkups.
- Help making health care appointments.
- Help finding community resources.
- Health education and guidance.
- Assist with payments for necessary physical and dental exams.
