Dorn discussed the rationale behind closing the Parents as Teachers Program, and discussed the related staffing impacts.

Dorn discussed the status of the 2003 N Lincoln building; it is quite empty after the discontinuing of programming that serves individual needs in the public.

Dorn discussed the plans for meeting with school nurses, to discuss school health requirements, immunization audits, dental audits, trainings, etc. While the dental audits are by coded the responsibility of the local BoH, they are commonly taken care of by the oral child health provider. American Home Findings has said they will complete the dental audits. There are plans for providing flu shots in the schools for those who want them and provide parental permission. Vision screening is no longer available to the students through child health. MCPHD will make the vision screener available, along with a non-licensed staff member to assist, if the school RN will take responsibility for providing those screenings in their school. Tobacco prevention work will be available to schools again this year.

MCPHD is providing CPR and STB training to schools who have reached out. Disease containment and 10% school absence reporting requirement discussed.

Dorn provided the Workforce Development grant work plan.

Dorn noted that MCPHD is providing data and support to the EMS Essentials work group.

Dorn reported that a MPH Student requested an internship and will assist with CHA-CHIP. Data has been passed to him, it will be work off site.

Succession Planning is under way for Dorn's retirement on January 3, 2025.
