Schools out for the Summer! Be proactive and get your child vaccinated for their required immunizations before going back to school in August.

Required Vaccines:

Ages 4-6

- Chickenpox
- DtAp
- Measles/Mumps/Rubella
- Polio
- Hep B

<u>Ages 11-12</u>

- Meningococcal (A,C,W,Y serogroups)
- Tdap

<u>Ages 16-18</u>

Meningococcal (A,C,W,Y serogroups)

Recommended Vaccines:

<u>All Ages</u>

- Flu (influenza vaccine) Ages 11-12
- Human papillomavirus (HPV) <u>Ages 16-18</u>
- Meningococcal Serogroup B

No Cost Vaccines available!

Adults 19 and older who are uninsured or underinsured.

Children 0 through 18 who are on Medicaid, uninsured, American Indian/Alaskan Native.

IOWA MEASLES INITIATIVE

Marion County Public Health is providing the MMR vaccine, free of charge, for all individuals regardless of insurance status.

In 2025, more than 1,000 cases have been confirmed nationwide, including a case in central lowa. If you or your child are not up to date on your vaccinations, now is the time to get protected!
